
What is an Indigenous People's Cultural College

Indigenous Bachelor of Social Work

Several years ago, First Nations communities expressed a need for social work education that was rooted within an Indigenous Foundation. In response, a Social Work Task Force (SWFT) was formed, and the core worked alongside the First Nations Adult and Higher Education Consortium (FNEHEC) Council of Elders to develop Ethical standards necessary for social work practices that supports our vision of "communities living in a sacred manner." The SWFT formed the Indigenous Bachelor of Social Work.
