IMSW 5600: Community Learning (500 Hours in total, students will begin community Learning January in IMSW 5600P). (If students require more time for Summer will be allowed, provided this is part of the students Learning Plan which will be approved in January).

Students will present their capstones to end the program.

The IMSW program is open to self-determining applicants who are committed to decolonization, honour Indigenous knowledge, and meet the following admission requirements.

- 1. Four-year Indigenous baccalaureate degree (IBSW.)
- 2. A GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale, based on the last year's official transcripts.
- One to two years of full-time work or volunteer experience in the human services field. Senior mature adults with two years of broader non-Social Work experience are also welcomed to apply.
- 4. A four-page written proposal of intent that discusses the prospective student's future or desired applications of the Indigenous social work practice.
- 5. A current resume.
- 6. Two reference letters from professional sources; one educational and one work-related.
- 7. One letter from their mentoring elder or knowledge keeper.

Application Deadline: December 1, 2023. Applicants will be informed of final decisions in January 2024.
